Several of these projects need to be advanced as soon as possible in order to take advantage of early season bidding that will result in the City receiving more favorable bid prices on these projects. Having these projects ready to bid in the near future will result in allowing the City to do more with less.

So if the City is going to advance a paving project other than the 2nd Ward Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Paving Project, we need to identify the streets that you wish to pave in each ward as soon as possible. Construction cost estimates and a listing of streets in each Ward that need to be paved were previously provided to you. As A group, I hope collectively we can have some serious discussion on repaving South Park and Electric Avenues as they are in deplorable condition. This would be in addition to streets that need to be paved in the other Wards. There also can be savings realized in making the paving project one very large project, including the CDBG Paving Project as there are economies of scale.

We must also advance the Ridge Road Bridge at Rosary Avenue Project as this project will take the most lead time due to the nature of its construction and the special coordination with the Buffalo & Pittsburgh Railroad and the New York State Department of Transportation. You have been brought up to speed of the structural issues related to this bridge through correspondence from me to your Honorable Body in the past.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$975,000 BONDS OF THE CITY OF LACKAWANNA, ERIE COUNTY, NEW YORK, TO PAY THE COST OF VARIOUS CAPITAL ITEMS FOR SAID CITY.

WHEREAS, all conditions precedent to the financing of the capital projects hereinafter described, including compliance with the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, have been performed; **NOW**, **THERERFORE**, **BE IT**

ORDAINED, by the affirmative vote of **not less than two-thirds of the total voting strength** of the Council of the City of Lackawanna, Erie County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. The following capital items in and for the City of Lackawanna, Eire County, New York, are hereby authorized:

- a) Purchase of playground equipment and improvements to parks and recreation areas, at a maximum estimated cost of \$550,000, being a class of objects or purposes having a period of probable usefulness of fifteen years pursuant to subdivision 19© of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law
- b) Purchase of a snow plow truck, at a maximum estimated cost of \$225,000, being a specific object or purpose having a period of probable usefulness of fifteen years pursuant to subdivision 28 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 Of the Local Finance Law; and
- c) Demolition of city-owned buildings, at a maximum estimated cost of \$200,000, being a class of class of objects or purposes having a period of probable usefulness of ten years pursuant to subdivision 12-a of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 2. The plan for the financing of the aforesaid purposes consist of the issuance of \$975,000 bonds of said City, hereby authorized to be issued therefore pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, which shall be allocated as per the maximum estimated costs set forth in Section 1 hereof.

Section 3. The faith and credit of said City of Lackawanna, Erie County, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be obligations as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said City, a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same become due and payable.

<u>Section 4.</u> Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the serial bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the City Comptroller, the chief fiscal officer of said City. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said City Comptroller, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 5.

All other matters, except as provided herein relating to the bonds herein authorized including date, denominations, maturities, interest payment dates, and whether said bonds shall be repaid in accordance with a schedule providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same and also including the consolidation with other issues, shall be determined by the City Comptroller, the chief fiscal officer of

such City. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals in addition to those required by section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the City Comptroller shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

<u>Section 6.</u> This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

Section 7. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- 1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said City is not authorized to expend money
- 2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this bond ordinance are not substantially compiled with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
- 3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

<u>Section 8.</u> The City Clerk shall cause this ordinance to be published in summary form in the official newspaper of said City, together with a notice in substantial conformity with Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law, and such ordinance shall take effect immediately upon such publication.

I am submitting to you a list of streets that we have formulated through our work session along with the values.

Bid Project 1 is a list of 'Mill and Fill' streets that will consist of milling off the old surface, a few inches down, and a new surface replacing it. Curbs and drainage will **not be** included because this will derail the scope of the projects and add significant cost to the projects. This assed cost would reduce the amount of streets that could be paved.

Bid Project 2 includes two streets that need extensive work other than 'mill and fill' and will need work from Erie County Sewer District 6 and more detail overall. Lincoln was never designed for storm water drainage and we will be looking to tie in some drainage for this road. For those of us who grew up in Bethlehem Park, we will always remember that this street always flooded during heavy rains. Steelawanna, around Wilson, has a foundation problem of significance which must be addressed, and we would like to add drainage to add to this to this project's longevity.

I have also included a list of reserve streets that need work, but funds may not be available this year. (List on file in City Clerk's office)

I would like to have the listed streets bid on the next agenda and with the Council vote, we can have the RFP ready to be voted for on the next agenda. Construction contractors are now slotting in their projects for the year.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,000,000 BONDS OF THE CITY OF LACKAWANNA, ERIE COUNTY, NEW YORK, TO PAY THE COST OF VARIOUS CAPITAL ITEMS FOR SAID CITY

WHEREAS, all conditions precedent to the financing of the capital projects hereinafter described, including compliance with the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, have been performed; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

ORDAINED, by the affirmative vote of **not less than two-thirds of the total voting strength** of the Council of the City of Lackawanna, Erie County, New York, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. The following capital items in and for the City of Lackawanna, Erie County, New York, including incidental improvements and expenses, are hereby authorized:

- a) Purchase of totes, at a maximum estimated cost of \$425,000, being a class of objects or purposes having a period of probable usefulness of five years pursuant to subdivision 32 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law;
- b) Paving of streets, at a maximum estimated cost of \$1,250,000, being a class of objects or purposes having a period of probable usefulness of fifteen years pursuant to subdivision 20c of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law; and
- c) Improvements to bridges, at a maximum estimated cost of \$1,325,000, being a class of objects or purposes having a period of probable usefulness of twenty years pursuant to subdivision 10 paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 2. The plan for the financing of the aforesaid purposes consists of the issuance of \$3,000,000 bonds of said City, hereby authorized to be issued therefore pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, which shall be allocated as per the maximum estimated costs set forth in Section 1 hereof.

<u>Section 3</u>. The faith and credit of said City of Lackawanna, Erie County, New York, are herby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said City, a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same become due and payable.

<u>Section 4</u>. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the

serial bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes is hereby delegated to the City Comptroller, the chief fiscal officer of said City. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said City Comptroller, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 5. All other matters, except as provided herein relating to the bonds herein authorized including date, denominations, maturities, interest payment dates, and whether said bonds shall be repaid in accordance with a schedule providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same and also including the consolidation with other issues, shall be determined by the City Comptroller, the chief fiscal officer of said City. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals in addition to those required by section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the City Comptroller shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

<u>Section 6</u>. This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

- <u>Section 7</u>. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:
 - 1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said City is not authorized to expend money, or
 - 2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this bond ordinance are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution. Section 8. The City Clerk shall cause this ordinance to be published in summary form in the official newspaper of said City, together with a notice in substantial conformity with Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law, and such ordinance shall take effect immediately upon such publication.

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Lackawanna, New York as follows:

SECTION 1 The City Charter of the City of Lackawanna, New York requires that the City Council, at a meeting thereof, held not later than the 10th day of June, adopt a Current Expense Budget for the fiscal year, August 1, 2013 through July 31, 2014, showing all City expenditures and revenues and including the real property tax rate.

SECTION 2 That the sum of \$9,250,081.00, being the entire amount determined to be necessary to be raised by taxation to defray the expense of the City for the 2013-2014 fiscal year, apportioned in the amount of \$4,543,307.00 for properties qualifying as homestead properties and \$4,706,774.00 for non-homestead properties, in accordance with the detailed statement of revenues and expenses as estimated and adopted by the City Council, be and the same is hereby levied upon all real and personal property subject to taxation upon the assessment roll of the City of Lackawanna for the 2013-2014 fiscal year.

SECTION 3 That the City Clerk be and hereby is directed to extend and apportion the said sum levied and to be raised by taxation as aforesaid in the last assessment roll of the City of Lackawanna delivered to her and to deliver a certified duplicate of the same, with a warrant annexed, under the seal of the City of Lackawanna, to the City Treasurer, commanding her to receive, levy and collect the several sums in said roll specified as assessed against the persons or property therein mentioned or described with such percentage in the manner provided by law for the collection and levying of City taxes by the City Treasurer.

SECTION 4 That the following schedule be and the same is hereby adopted as the current Expense Budget of the City of Lackawanna for the fiscal year August 1, 2013 through July 31, 2014, along with the revenues and taxation estimated and levied herein, and that same be and hereby is appropriated in the sums set forth in the third column of said schedule to the use of the several boards, departments and offices for the purposes enumerated therein, to wit:

Homestead Tax Rate: \$13.78 of assessed valuation Non-Homestead Tax: \$28.87 of assessed valuation

SECTION 5 That the City Clerk be and she hereby is directed to forward a copy of this Ordinance to the City Treasurer, Director of Administration and Finance, City Comptroller and the City Attorney's Office.

Veto of Council Budget

1. To: City Council

After a careful review of the city budget proposed by the City Council on June 10, 2013, I find that the council budget is not acceptable.

Please be advised that pursuant to section 4.4 of the Charter, I am vetoing the entire budget proposed by the City Council.

There are glaring inefficiencies that cannot be overlooked, along with union contract violations and other areas of attempted savings that are simply not realistic, including but not limited to the following:

- \$210,000 of attempted savings originates from overtime, court time, and differential from the police and fire departments is not realistic. With most contracts approved and mandatory court time, these savings will not be realized.
- Deleting a code enforcement officer with a no layoff clause in the union contract results in an attempted savings of \$48,019 savings, will not be realized. The person with the lowest seniority will be removed and he is also our storm-water officer.
- Deleting a Part Time Clerk position from the mayor's office, with a proposed \$2000 savings, will not allow my secretary to a have temporary replacement and will prevent me from keeping the open door policy that has always been in place for the mayor's office.
- Overtime for proctoring Civil Service Exams was deleted. Most of our civil service exams have expired and tests will be held. The council budget has left no money to pay for proctors.
- Travel allowance was deleted for all employees, yet the city municipal code under section 5-64A declares that: *Practices and regulations. Each department head shall keep informed as to the latest practices in his or her particular field and shall inaugurate, with the approval of the Mayor, such new practices and regulations as appear to be of benefit to the administrative service of the City and to the public.*

- In the Recreation Department, key people who run nutrition programs, and much more, had a minor increased pay raise reduced, while the driver's got a raise.
- The Recreation Director, under your proposed budget will make just \$500 over her union held clerk position, which was deleted from your budget with no line item, another union violation.
- Signal maintenance man was moved from contractual code to a salaried code. This person is an independent contractor and not an employee.
- Books and periodicals from the Comptroller's office were reduced to a value that cannot purchase the most basic of supplies
- The comptroller's consultant was implemented in the contract, which was signed last year. This omission is violating the contract.
- By adjusting our building cleaner, this line item is also under budgeted.

These are some but not all of the obvious maladjusted budget items that clearly show that the council proposed budget will not be balanced, along with union and other contract violations, therefore, it leaves me no other option then to veto the entire City Council proposed budget.

Veto of Council Budget

1. To: City Council

After a careful review of the city budget proposed by the City Council on June 10, 2013, I find that the council budget is not acceptable.

Please be advised that pursuant to section 4.4 of the Charter, I am vetoing the entire budget proposed by the City Council.

There are glaring inefficiencies that cannot be overlooked, along with union contract violations and other areas of attempted savings that are simply not realistic, including but not limited to the following:

- \$210,000 of attempted savings originates from overtime, court time, and differential from the police and fire departments is not realistic. With most contracts approved and mandatory court time, these savings will not be realized.
- Deleting a code enforcement officer with a no layoff clause in the union contract results in an attempted savings of \$48,019 savings, will not be realized. The person with the lowest seniority will be removed and he is also our storm-water officer.
- Deleting a Part Time Clerk position from the mayor's office, with a proposed \$2000 savings, will not allow my secretary to a have temporary replacement and will prevent me from keeping the open door policy that has always been in place for the mayor's office.
- Overtime for proctoring Civil Service Exams was deleted. Most of our civil service exams have expired and tests will be held. The council budget has left no money to pay for proctors.

- Travel allowance was deleted for all employees, yet the city municipal code under section 5-64A declares that: Practices and regulations. Each department head shall keep informed as to the latest practices in his or her particular field and shall inaugurate, with the approval of the Mayor, such new practices and regulations as appear to be of benefit to the administrative service of the City and to the public.
- In the Recreation Department, key people who run nutrition programs, and much more, had a minor increased pay raise reduced, while the driver's got a raise.
- The Recreation Director, under your proposed budget will make just \$500 over her union held clerk position, which was deleted from your budget with no line item, another union violation.
- Signal maintenance man was moved from contractual code to a salaried code. This person is an independent contractor and not an employee.
- Books and periodicals from the Comptroller's office were reduced to a value that cannot purchase the most basic of supplies
- The comptroller's consultant was implemented in the contract, which was signed last year. This omission is violating the contract.
- By adjusting our building cleaner, this line item is also under budgeted.

These are some but not all of the obvious maladjusted budget items that clearly show that the council proposed budget will not be balanced, along with union and other contract violations, therefore, it leaves me no other option then to veto the entire City Council proposed budget.

Chapter 160. EVICTION FOR ILLEGAL DRUG ACTIVITY.

160.1 DEFINITIONS.

As used in this division, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated.

Premises: means a building or structure, or any part thereof.

Owner: means the landlord of the premises, including his/her agent.

Tenant: in addition to its ordinary meaning, shall include an occupant of one or more rooms in a rooming house or a resident, not including a transient occupant, of one or more rooms in a hotel who has been in possession for 30 consecutive days or longer.

Illegal Drug Activity: means use or possession of a controlled substance or marihuana [marijuana], as defined by the New York State Penal Law.

Criminal Conviction: means the entry of a plea of guilty to or a verdict for one or more counts set forth in an accusatory instrument.

160.2: EVICTION FOR USE OR OCCUPATION OF PREMISES FOR ILLEGAL DRUG ACTIVITY.

A special proceeding to evict a tenant from leased premises may be maintained upon the ground that the premises, or any part thereof, have been used occupied for the purpose of illegal activity.

160.3: PROCEDURES.

The procedures applicable to summary proceedings to recover possession of real property under State Law shall be applicable top any proceeding brought under this chapter.

160.4: SERVICE OF NOTICE, COMMENCEMENT OF EVICTION PROCEEDINGS.

A. The following persons, corporations and agencies may serve personally upon the owner or landlord, or upon his agent, of demised real property used or occupied, in whole or in part, for the use or possession of illegal drugs, a written notice requiring the owner or landlord to make an application for the removal of the person(s) so using or occupying the premises:

- 1. Any domestic corporation organized for the suppression of vice, subject to, or which submits visitation by the New York State Department of Social Service or the Erie County Department of Social Services, and possess a certification from such department of such fact and of such conformity with regulations of the department.
- 2. Any duly authorized enforcement agency of New York State, or a subdivision thereof, and/or the City of Lackawanna, under a duty to enforce the provisions of the Penal Law or of any State or Local Law, ordinance, code, rule or regulation relating to buildings.

B. If the owner or landlord, or his agent, does not make such application within five days thereafter, or having made it, does not in good faith diligently prosecute it, the person, corporation or enforcement agency giving notice may bring a proceeding under this chapter for such removal as though the petitioner were the owner or the landlord of the premises, and shall have precedence over any similar proceeding thereafter brought by such owner or landlord or to the one theretofore brought by him and not prosecuted diligently and in good faith. Proof of all the ill repute of the demised premises, or of the occupants thereof, or of those resorting thereto, shall constitute presumptive evidence of the unlawful use of the demised premises required to be started in the petition for removal. Both the person(s) in possession of the property and the owner or landlord shall be made respondents in the proceeding.

160.5: MULTIPLE CONVICTIONS CONSTITUTE PRESUMPTIVE EVIDENCE.

Two or more convictions of any person or persons had, within a period of one year for any of the offenses defined in Article 220 or 221 of the Penal Law, arising out of conduct engaged in the same real property consisting of a dwelling as that term is defined in Subdivision 4 of the New York State Multiple Dwelling Law, shall be presumptive evidence of conduct constituting use and occupancy of the premises for the purpose of using and possessing illegal drugs and of the tenant knowledge thereof.

160.6: CIVIL PENALTIES.

A court granting a petition pursuant to this section may, in addition to any other order provided by law, make an order imposing and requiring the payment by the respondent of a civil penalty not exceeding five-thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) to the City of Lackawanna, in which subject premises is located, and the payment of reasonable attorneys' fees and the cost of the proceeding to the petitioner. In any case, multiple respondents shall be jointly and severally liable for any payment so ordered, and the amounts of such payments constitute a lien upon the subject real property.

Four Year Fiscal Outlook Response

I am responding to Mr. Pirowski's request for a 4 year fiscal outlook of the General Fund, which does not adjust any of the revenues and incorporates all the new union contracts. I feel that this is not only unrealistic but not financially or legally sound as the City must stay within the Constitutional Tax Limit and the Property Tax Cap, unless your honorable body votes to override the Property Tax Cap. As such, to disregard these limits and request that appropriations not be adjusted to stay within these limits is a disregard for the Constitution and Municipal Law. This process does and will take place during the normal budget process in April and May. As the Constitutional Tax Limit is based on the 5 year average full valuation of taxable assessed valuation, estimated amounts will need to be provided by the City Assessor. Additionally, it

allows for exclusions for debt service so I need to know if there are any plans for additional Bond Anticipation Notes or Bonds within the 4 years you have requested. Please also advise if your honorable body plans to adopt a shift in any of the upcoming 4 years and the tax rates for homestead and non-homestead. Therefore, please provide the needed information so that the Constitutional Tax Limit and the Property Tax Cap for these years can be calculated to ensure that the City will be in compliance. Once this is complete I will notify your honorable body and you can advise as to the appropriations which you would like adjusted to stay within the Tax Limits specified above, if necessary. Please keep in mind that section 12 of the City Charter requires that the Mayor submit his budget for approval to your honorable body. As the Mayor is not involved in any of the numbers you will be providing, the budgets and therefore fund balances will only be speculation as the required protocol is not being followed for the budget process.
