A Message from Mayor Annette Iafallo – Curfew in Lackawanna Tuesday, June 2 starting at 8pm.

Due to ongoing concerns related to protester violence occurring in Buffalo and potentially in surrounding communities including Lackawanna, Erie County Executive Poloncarz has declared a curfew in Lackawanna – along with Buffalo, Amherst, Cheektowaga, Tonawanda and West Seneca – for tonight, Tuesday June 2 from 8pm through to 5am Wednesday.

Below is a post from the County Executive's Facebook page. Please note the condition for essential worker travel.

Be aware that for Buffalo only, this curfew will be in place from Tuesday through Sunday. For Lackawanna and the other communities associated with the County Executive's order, the need for curfew extensions will be evaluated on a daily basis. Updates would be communicated as soon as possible.

After consultation with NYS, Buffalo Mayor Byron Brown, Amherst Supervisor Brian Kulpa, Tonawanda Supervisor Joe Emminger, West Seneca Supervisor Gary Dickson, Cheektowaga supervisor Diane Benczkowski and Lackawanna Mayor Annette Iafallo I am imposing a curfew for all those communities from 8 pm tonight to 5 am tomorrow.

Essential workers can travel during curfew hours but should have proof of employment (ID, etc.).

Once again, a curfew from 8pm tonight to 5am tomorrow will be in effect for the Cities of Buffalo and Lackawanna and Towns of Amherst, Cheektowaga, Tonawanda and West Seneca.
