On June 20, 2020, the Fire Department was called for a house fire at 27 Victory Avenue. Upon arrival there were cars parked on both side of the street making it difficult for the fire apparatus to get down the street to the house that was on fire. Because of the cars parked on both sides of the street, there was less than three feet of space on each side of the fire truck, making it difficult to establish a feed to the pumper from the hydrant. The firefighters also had difficulty getting ladders and tools from the trucks due to the limited amount of space.

The same condition with parked cars exists on Colton Avenue.

I am requesting your Honorable Body to enact an ordinance creating the alternate parking of vehicles for both Victory and Colton Avenues. With vehicles being permitted to park on only one side of the street. Emergency vehicles along with other city trucks with have ample space to operate.

<u>Potential Use of Bike Paths to Quiet Ridge Road, Improve Bike and Pedestrian Safety, and Add Multi-Modal Connectivity to Regional Destinations.</u>

21. To: Common Council of the City of Lackawanna

Over the past year we have had numerous communications from residents regarding safety concerns along Ridge Road.

In addition, this office's observation has been that truck traffic levels, the width of the thoroughfare, and the actual speed of commercial vehicles have created a noise pressure nuisance-like condition on the streets, and also appears to make it more difficult for pedestrians to cross Ridge Road. Furthermore, noise pressures appear to make it difficult to carry on conversations along Ridge Road, which impairs the use of outdoor space to support local businesses.

In May 2020, CPL and the City Engineers completed a traffic study which concluded additional signals were not warranted, and suggested a road diet (a/k/a lane reductions) be implemented to quiet the roadway and ease the ability of pedestrians to cross Ridge Road, particularly in the First Ward. Also, since February, we have been looking at ways to draw off the regional resource of Shoreline Bike Trail, which now connects Lackawanna to downtown Buffalo through a path on the west side of Route 5, and is expected to be extended further south to Woodlawn Beach.

The concerns about Ridge Road traffic noise and related safety concerns appear to be addressable through a road dieting plan which would limit Ridge Road east-west vehicular traffic to one lane, and use the freed up thoroughfare space to create safe bike lanes connecting our downtown heart at Ridge Road and South Park to the Shoreline Trail.

We have been working with GoBike and their traffic engineer to design concept plans that could be quickly implemented on a trial basis to install safe bike lanes which would encourage a safe bicycling community, and would also enhance our downtown commercial district.

They have prepared three options which are attached for your consideration. I ask that you allow a ten minute presentation by GoBike to explain each of the options; then we could use the break between council sessions to review the options and receive public comments, and determine how to move forward.

GoBike has been providing engineering and design work without any charge to us, and has grant funding for restriping, vertical delineators (synthetic bollards), and construction, but not for added costs for signage.

The proposed Project would also help connect our downtown hub with a regional bike Southern Tier connector trail they are working on that would go from Buffalo to Ellicottville, New York.

This office is in agreement with the County's comments and suggest the proposed amendment to Chapter 75 of the City Code now be amended to read as set forth in Attachment A hereto. If this honorable body could provide any other comments to the proposed Code Amendments we could then modify the same, and have resolutions prepared for adopting the same at our next meeting.

Submission of Communication and Proposal Regarding Smokes Creek Erosion Issue.

Honorable Council Members:

My name is Thomas DiVito. My wife, Patricia and I and my family have been residents of 190 Sharon Parkway for over thirty (30) years. We have maintained and improved our property outstandingly and are proud to be residents of a wonderful neighborhood.

As many in attendance here may be aware, for over twelve (12) years I have pursued an effort to restore the creek bank and replace lost soil due to an erosion issue created by lack of maintenance by the City of Lackawanna and poor original design of the 1960's Federal Flood Control Project of the Smokes Creek. Not only has this been a public safety issue but also threatens the integrity of my home.

On June 16, 2016 the Szymanski Administration passed a Budget Ordinance Sections 1-5 to appropriate \$107,000.00 for the Capital Project of Stream Bank Erosion on Sharon Parkway. This allowed the hiring of an engineering firm to begin a study for a remediation plan. I Thank the City for initializing this. I submitted a Freedom of Information Request to the City of Lackawanna on June 19, 2020 to "establish a timeline and expenditures to date for remediation regarding this continuing condition." Those documents revealed payments to three engineering firms – none of which presented satisfactory recommendations. I know for a fact, soil samples were taken from my property twice because the first samples were "lost". I believe AECOM is possibly working with the NYSDEC but the FOIL request shows no invoices or payments to that firm to date as of January 31, 2019.

As disappointing as it seems, I feel all work done by these engineering firms has been a tremendous waste of funding, since they all have had unsatisfactory designs. None of them included replacing my lost property nor correcting the migration of the creek channel twenty-five (25) feet towards my home. All the necessary design information, specifications, and guidelines are stated and described on the NYSDEC website and are easily interpreted.

In short: Of the original \$107,000.00 appropriated, \$65,257.70 has been spent – leaving a balance of \$41,742.30. What change in the erosion issue has this yielded? **NO CHANGE AT ALL!** In fact, because of the delays in any action, the situation has exponentially worsened. From a property survey done in April of 2019 I had lost two thousand seven-hundred (2,700) square feet of property. Seventeen (17) feet at the west end and fifteen (15) feet at the east end along one-hundred eighty (180) feet of back lot line. You can be assured more land has been lost since last year. I can physically see it and my mature evergreens now perched atop a cliff prove it...

Your Honorable Body-

I have spent over twelve (12) years of my life researching and contacting *every* available source for creek bank restoration. These contacts have ranged from the Secretary of the Army (USACE), to ALL local representatives – Assemblyman, Senator, Congressman, the NYSDEC Commissioner, the local USACE Divisions, NYS and Erie County Fish and Widelife Departments, Forestry Departments, Land Restoration,

County Executive Poloncarz, Trout Unlimited, the Buffalo Niagara Waterkeepers, and yes numerous others. **ALL TO NO AVAIL.** All claim the NYSDEC resides over this.

I believe the NYSDEC has been trying to dissuade me from any action. Sadly, I am only one voice at this point. I had advised years ago that despite their bureaucratic delays and procrastination I would not allow my home to fall victim to their incompetence.

I was promised fourteen (14) months ago a viewing of the proposed plan. Requests to do so have been ignored. Mr. Myers states the plan is 90% completed in Albany. I am of the mindset there actually is no plan to remedy this situation. Should they have indeed developed a plan and it does not include replacing my lost property, then it stands as unacceptable.

I have in my possession the FOIL request from April 23, 2009 from the United States Army Corps of Engineers. This contains copies of the inspection reports of the channel done with the City Officials. In fact, the 1984 reports describe - #5. Banks – one eroded area on the right bank, south branch, near upstream limits should be monitored" – that inspection detail was referring to my property and it was never addressed or monitored.

In other words the City has been negligent in maintaining the upkeep of the channel since before 1984 – I have supporting documentation. Had they cooperated with the USACE, a plan could have been implemented for restoration. Instead, the channel was classed as "inactive C-5 poor" and lost eligibility. On August 21, 2006 the channel was inspected and failed —as explained in the following letter.

This is to notify you upon receipt of this correspondence, the Smokes Creek flood damage reduction project will be placed in an "Inactive" status. Under the current policy in Engineer Pamphlet (EP 500-1-1), Section 5.8 for Federal and non-Federal projects, a project that receives an overall condition rating of "Unacceptable", shall be immediately placed in an inactive status in the Rehabilitation and Inspection Program (RIP) and, therefore, becomes ineligible for Public Law (PL 84-99) rehabilitation assistance until the deficiencies have been corrected.

As discussed during our November 9, 2006 meeting regarding the latest periodic inspection for Smokes Creek conducted on August 21-22, 2006, the Smokes Creek channel system resulted in a project condition rating of C-5 or "Unacceptable" condition. Moreover, we have worked with your office each year, to include the last three years in which your project has been evaluated at a C-5 rating. During this time, as indicated in each inspection report, there has been little or no evidence of annual maintenance being performed.

The condition rating of "Unacceptable" is due to extensive shoaling in the channel and overall encroachment of heavy vegetation. The project as a system is rated "C-5 Poor" in accordance with Appendix C of Engineer Regulation (ER 1130-2-530), "Flood Control O & M Policies" or "Unacceptable" under the new guidelines presented in the USACE "Levee Owner's Manual for Non-Federal Flood Control Works" (March 2006). The deficiencies found over the last three years, including 2006 inspection, will adversely impact the effectiveness of the flood damage reduction project. Consequently, the project will not provide the level of protection of public health and safety it was designed for during a flood event.

We understand based on our previous discussions and meetings that you have a plan to correct deficiencies. We will continue to provide the technical assistance that we can, as you develop and implement corrective actions that will allow the Smokes Creek flood damage reduction project to return active status in the Rehabilitation and Inspection Program.

We have provided a copy of this letter to state and local Congressional representatives, FEMA Region II, the Erie County Department of Public Works, and the City of Lackawanna mayor regarding the project rating, as required by our regulations (ER1130-2-530, paragraph 3-3.g; or ER 500-1-1, paragraph 5-5.c). A copy of the latest inspection report will be provided to any of these entities upon request by contacting the undersigned.

DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY, BUFFALO DISTRICT CORPS OF ENGINEERS

I offer to you, Council President Marrano, Honorable Council Members, and to your Honorable Mayor Iafallo the following proposal for your consideration:

I have researched material costs, machinery rental, and NYS DEC recommended methods for stream erosion restoration. I have had a Licensed Structural Engineer complete a report on my home last year to establish a base for comparison. Number 166 Sharon has a rear basement wall settling downward to collapse. This remediation for my property **MUST** be completed this year.

Below is a simple breakdown to repair the migrated channel and replace my 1/6th of an acre of lost property. This will return mY home's current assessment to \$188,000.00 – <u>it has dropped \$83,000.00</u> – barely \$10,000.00 more than I purchased it for in 1989. This loss is heartbreaking to say the least. I ask you give this estimate your utmost consideration.

As you can see from the Estimated Material Cost it would be covered by the balance left from the initial appropriations of 2016. Obviously, there is always a possibility for unexpected expenses. However, the balance remaining from the original Capital Project of Stream Bank Erosion certainly incorporates additional costs if needed.

I submit this to you with a **ZERO DOLLAR** labor cost. I would be operating the excavator, as I have experience with heavy equipment. I will be working in a private stream legally restoring my private property. The City – if it does not already exist – would be required to insure the rental machine for damage.

This proposal:

- 1. Restores my lost property
- 2. Stabilizes and prevents any damage to my home
- 3. Raises my home's value to proper assessment
- 4. Eliminates safety issues and personal anxieties
- 5. Produces a positive affect on the flood waters downstream as in its current condition velocity and erosion downstream have increased
- 6. Eliminates any further reconstruction or soil loss due to antiquated design Please note: I have supporting documentation for all references and statements. Thank you. Sincerely.
