LACKAWANNA CITY HALL OPEN BY APPOINTMENT ONLY STARTING NOVEMBER 16, 2020

Senior Center also temporarily closed to help prevent spread of Covid-19 virus

LACKAWANNA, NY (Sunday, November 15, 2020) – Lackawanna Mayor Annette Iafallo has announced that effective Monday, November 16, 2020 and until further notice, all public business conducted at City Hall will be done by appointment only and the Lackawanna Senior Center located at 230 Martin Road will be closed to the public. These measures were undertaken to help prevent further spread of the Covid-19 virus per current guidance provided by New York State and Erie County Health Departments.

Lackawanna City Hall offices will remain staffed Monday – Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. except for the Treasurer's and City Clerk's offices, which close at 4:00 p.m. Those wishing to make an appointment are asked to contact the appropriate City of Lackawanna department using the phone and email directory found on the city website at http://lackawannany.gov/contact/.

Anyone entering Lackawanna City Hall for an appointment will be required to comply with social distancing and other precautions including, properly wearing a protective face mask, maintaining a safe social distance of at least 6 feet, using hand sanitizer often, and staying home if not feeling well - especially if experiencing a fever or flu-like symptoms.

During the temporary closure of the Lackawanna Senior Center, no lunches, activities or van services will be provided EXCEPT for the Meals on Wheels program.
