The adjusted lines are faded and hard to see, especially at night, and the pre-existing lines are still visible, adding confusion as to the actual travel lane. He requests the full attention of the Council before there is a tragedy.
- 13. Joseph Lango, Resident Submits a communication with the following concerns:
 - 1. Abbott Road is in need of repair under both underpasses. Who is responsible for this?
 - 2. Railroad crossing at Martin Road is in need of repairs.
 - 3. Railroad property behind Maryknoll Drive from Martin Road to Smokes Creek needs to be cleaned up. There is debris in the ditch; the overgrowth of heavy brush and trees is home for unwanted animals. The railroad used to clean this up. I have not seen them for about 15 years.
- 14. <u>Denise Abbott, AFL-CIO</u> Requests the City Council approve plans to utilize a small portion of Lackawanna City streets for a Labor Day parade, Monday, September 6th. We will start our lineup on Dorrance Avenue, near the cemetery, at 11 am. The parade, which includes marchers, floats, marching bands, the Erie County Sheriff's Mounted Patrol, as well as many local politicians and local organizations, will start at 12 noon and head directly into the City of Buffalo via McKinley Parkway.
