# A MESSAGE OF THANKS FROM LACKAWANNA MAYOR ANNETTE IAFALLO

I would like offer special thanks to the many business owners, business partners, City employees, residents and volunteers whose incredible acts of dedication, bravery, generosity and kindness helped the City of Lackawanna weather and begin to recover from the recent 'generational' snowstorm.

While there are too many individual acts to list, I'd like to share one which truly highlights how our community pulled together:

The Lackawanna Senior Center served as one of five City warming / refuge shelters during the snowstorm, along with all three firehouses and the Willie Cotton Center on Gates Avenue.

At the storm's peak, nearly 130 people were temporarily housed at the Senior Center – approximately 70 related to vehicle rescues, with many of the rescued people coming from across the country or around the world for the holidays. Of those rescued, 17 were accomplished with the help of over 15 snowmobile volunteers who answered the City's call for assistance publicized on Facebook and through local media outlets.

Food and other supplies for these 130 people were made available through the generosity of various Lackawanna businesses, as well as volunteer cooks who prepared meals from the Lackawanna Middle/High School cafeteria and their homes – all transported to the Senior Center by the City's Public Safety Division.

In addition, members of the City Council and other City employees worked around the clock to help keep our 'guests' as comfortable as possible under the conditions. Once the Lackawanna driving ban was lifted on Tuesday, December 27th, all went on their way safely to other destinations.

Without this team effort and other similar efforts, it would have been very difficult for Lackawanna to survive this storm. Thankfully, we came together like family and pulled through in the spirit of the season!
