AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 190, SOLID WASTE, OF THE CITY OF LACKAWANNA MUNICIPAL CODE

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Lackawanna, New York as follows:

Section 190-12 (E) is hereby rescinded and replaced as follows:

- **E.** Penalties for offenses. The penalties for violations of the provisions of this chapter shall be as follows:
- (1) A fine of \$50.00 for the first violation.
- (2) A fine of \$100.00 for the second violation.
- (3) A fine of \$200.00 for the third violation.
- (4) A fine of \$300.00 for the fourth and subsequent violations.
- (5) In the event of succeeding and continuing violation(s) of this chapter, any person who shall be convicted of violating or failing to comply with the provisions of this chapter be punished by a fine of not more than \$250 or imprisonment for not exceeding 15 days, or both such fine and imprisonment. The continuation of such violation(s) for each successive day shall constitute a separate offense, and the person or persons allowing or permitting the continuation of a violation shall be punishable as above for each separate offense.

The LLC principal, Mr. Izzy Mohamed, is requesting this item be placed on the City Council Agenda for consideration at the council's October 21, 2024 meeting.

Included with this memo are copies of email communication on this matter from July-August of this year, which outlines the development options for the 3140 South Park parcel (including the parking use identified by Amanah) and various tax matters pertaining to Mr. Mohamed and affiliated LLC's as it pertains to 12-3 B of the City Charter.

It is noted that Mr. Mohamed is current on all taxes for properties in his personal name, however various affiliated LLC's are in arrears on city and school taxes. It is further noted that Amanah Enterprises, LLC is a new entity and not one of the LLC entities in arrears.

The current Open Space designation of these private parcels is incompatible with the land use definitions for these areas as outlined in the City's Comprehensive Plan crafted in 2016 and the attached 2019 zoning map – thereby hindering appropriate development and/or future sale.

Attached is a supporting letter from C&S Companies, who was selected earlier this year to lead a grantfunded project to update the City's Zoning Code. As noted in the communication, Phase I environmental tests were completed on three of the four ownership parcels within the past few years. These tests indicate the high likelihood of soil contamination on the parcels given their close proximity to former industrial / railroad lands.

The recommended rezoning of these parcels would NOT absolve the current or future owners from completing Phase II environmental testing at their expense for any planned development, which is a requirement of any site plans presented to the City Planning Board in accordance with SEQR. The first step in the rezoning process is the scheduling of a public meeting, which we would anticipate occurring on or around November 13th, pending City Council approval. Based on the outcome of that meeting, a rezoning resolution would be presented for City Council action before year-end 2024. Full consideration of this request by the City Council is appreciated.
