As you know, after a 15-year drought, the 2024-2025 Adopted State Budget finally included a \$50 million increase in unrestricted aid for cities, villages and towns (referred to as Temporary Municipal Assistance). While we appreciate that this did not translated into significant dollars for all of our

members, it was a major step forward and hopefully the beginning of a stronger and more meaningful state-local partnership.

It is essential that the State not only maintains the \$50 million in new assistance but that they build upon this critical investment to strengthen our communities and lower the property tax burden on our residents. Consequently, we need to leverage this momentum by first thanking our state leaders for the additional funding and then convincing them of the need for consistent and predictable increases in state aid for local governments that keep pace with inflation.

WHEREAS, after a prolonged period without financial support, local governments finally received an increase of \$50 million in unrestricted State Aid; and

WHEREAS, local officials express their gratitude for the \$50 million increase in unrestricted State Aid, recognizing it as a positive step towards addressing long-standing funding challenges; and

WHEREAS, the State has referred to this new aid as Temporary Municipal Assistance, suggesting that such increase may not continue, jeopardizing the sustainability of crucial municipal programs and services; and

WHEREAS, the property tax cap further limits the ability of local governments to properly fund the services their residents need; and

WHEREAS, increased and ongoing State Aid for local governments is vital for maintaining infrastructure, public safety, housing and other municipal services; and

WHEREAS, the challenges of rising inflation, the increasing costs of labor and supplies, and the end of extraordinary federal aid only accentuate the need for consistent and predictable funding to effectively plan for the future and meet the growing needs of their residents; and

Now, therefore, be it resolved, that the City of Lackawanna calls upon the Governor and the State Legislature to commit to continuing the additional \$50 million in unrestricted State Aid in the 2025-2026 State Budget and beyond, and

Be it further resolved, that the City of Lackawanna urges officials to recognize the need for a long-term plan that ensures consistent and predictable increases in financial support for local governments that keep pace with inflation.

No person, firm, company, or corporation shall keep, suffer, permit or allow to be kept on the premises owned or occupied by such person, firm, company or corporation any dog or dogs which create an unreasonably loud or disturbing noise, such as repeated or continual barking, howling or whining, so as to be detrimental to the life, health, safety or welfare of any individual.
 - 1. Any person, firm, company, or corporation in violation of this article is subject to a fine as enumerated in §66-13 of this Code.
 - 2. In determining whether any such noise is unreasonably loud or disturbing, due consideration shall include, but not be limited to, the following factors:
 - a. The loudness of the noise, as scientifically measured or otherwise;
 - b. The intensity of the noise, as measure by intervals;
 - c. The quality of the noise, as measured by pitch or tone;
 - d. The duration of the noise, as measured by time;
 - e. The composition of the noise, as measured by the number of offending dogs;
 - f. The time of day or night of the noise(s);
 - g. The proximity of the origin of such noise to the complainant;

A. In any case where the City completes property maintenance including but not limited to cuts, mows, board ups, or removes brush, weeds, grass, any other vegetation or debris as provided for in Article IV, § 135-17, then in such case, the property owner as recorded in the office for the Division of Assessment for said address will be charged the following sums of money for the City's service: [1]

Labor:

Labor rate based on FEMAs hourly wages at time work is being completed

Debris removal:

Property owners are responsible for paying all disposal/dumping fees associated with the clean up

Grass cutting:

1/4 acre area or less	\$200
1/4 acre - 1/2 acre area	\$350
1/2 acre - 3/4 acre area	\$400
3/4 acre - 1 acre area	\$450
Each additional 1/4 acre or less above 1 acre	\$200 each

Equipment pricing for DPW property clean up:

High lift	\$250/hr	
Tractor with mower	\$200/hr	
Skid steer	\$200/hr	
Dump truck	\$180/hr	
Weed whackers, chainsaws, other handheld equipment	\$50/hr	

B. In addition thereto, a surcharge of \$250 is to be added and paid for any such service performed by the City.[2]

C. If any such charge as provided for above remains unpaid for forty-five (45) days or more from the date of the first said notice to the owner, said charge shall be a lien upon the real property so improved by the City and shall be added and levied upon such parcel of assessed real property by the City

Treasurer and shall bear interest at the same rate as real property taxes and shall be collected and enforced in the same manner as general City taxes, or in the alternative, as the City may elect to collect any such amounts through Small Claims Court.
